Nature of Issue:

I am writing to you on behalf of the residents of Wharf Court (Spa Road, Melksham) in relation to the dangerous situation we now believe requires attention. As you will know, there is a problem with speeding vehicles in Spa Road. I am aware that there is now a speed indicator on the "hump" in Spa Road to try and slow traffic down, however, many vehicles ignore this and both myself and other residents have seen the indicator registering speeds in excess of 40mph. This makes it hazardous to safely drive out of Wharf Court as visibility up Spa Road is limited by the "hump" in the road when driving out and turning left or right. There is also a risk to drivers coming down Spa Road (towards town) to Wharf Court, who come over the "hump" then have to slow to turn or sometimes wait for someone else to come out before driving into Wharf Court. They risk a rear shunt from drivers coming down the road as they are not visible until the last minute to speeding, or indeed other drivers.

Is there any possibility that someone could arrange a site visit to come and assess the risks with a view to suggesting ways of reducing them before there is a serious accident or fatality? We have quite a busy car park due to relatives visiting, carers coming to look after residents, deliveries from supermarket vans etc. etc. so statistically, it is highly likely that there will be a serious incident before too long, especially as the road will only get busier as the town expands with more housing, cars etc. out by Bowerhill and the surrounding areas.

Nature of Issue: I am extremely concerned by one of the junctions on the road that I am currently living. The junction in question is where Lapwing Road, Melksham joins Linnet Lane, Melksham. I have two concerns which I have broken down into two sections. Concern 1 - road issues travelling along Linnet lane, turning left onto Lapwing road are cutting the corner by using the footpath. A large percentage of cars have at least two wheels on the pavement and I have seen occasions where cars have clipped the bushes on the garden on the corner. Along with road users inability to follow the 20mph speed limit means that any pedestrians on the corner or coming around the corner have a high probability of being struck and killed! This is the same as people joining Linnet Lane from Lapwing road are cutting the corner again across the pavement.

The route cause of the issue is that the road has been raised meaning that the road and the pavement are on the same level. There is no penalty for road users leaving the road area. Normally the raised pavement would provide some protection. I have highlighted these areas on the picture attachments. I would like Wiltshire council to install permanent metal bollards on the footpath as soon as possible to protect all pedestrians. I have witnessed several extremely close calls over the past few months and I am concerned that someone will be killed!







No.1

To amend the controlled zone at the existing Toucan crossing and extend the existing zig zag markings in **A350 Western Way** as follows:

- a) Northern side of carriageway centre of the crossing is at a point approximately 31 metres east of its roundabout junction with Semington Road. The controlled zone will be a distance of approximately 41 metres from the roundabout junction with Semington Road in an easterly direction;
- b) Southern side of carriageway centre of the crossing is at a point approximately 35 metres east of its roundabout junction with Semington Road. The controlled zone will cover a distance of approximately 65 metres from the roundabout junction with Semington Road in an easterly direction.

No.2

To change the status of the existing Zebra Crossing in **Semington Road** to become a "Parallel Crossing" (a combined pedestrian and cycle crossing which has priority over the road which it crosses) as follows:

Centre of the crossing is at a point approximately 15 metres north of the access to Melksham Mobile Home Park (centre). The controlled zone will cover a distance of approximately 41 metres from the roundabout junction with the A350 in a southerly direction.





Thank you for your letter regarding Electric Vehicle Charging Points (EVCPs) in Melksham.

I note your questions concerning Wiltshire Council's plans for vehicle charging and I trust you have seen the new Wiltshire Council Electric Vehicle Charging Strategy for 2021 to 2024. The Strategy details the council's arrangements and the future provision. The council's Strategy is guided by government guidance to ensure that a joined-up approach is undertaken across the country.

The government's outcomes with regard to funding for electric vehicle charging hits three of the four segments of the EV charging infrastructure market: Home Charging, Workplace Charging and Rapid Charging (on trunk roads). However, it recognises that the fourth sector, Destination Charging, is most suited to private sector investment.

The council's Melksham provision is what is known as a Destination Charging point. Historically the Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure on Wiltshire Council land was provided by a commercial provider BP Pulse, with their customers paying for the maintenance. However, BP Pulse are unable to undertake the replacement of the existing machines without a long-term commitment by Wiltshire Council for the provision. Due to the value of this request the council must follow a robust procurement exercise.

Wiltshire Council recognises that currently the private sector is still emerging so in the short term it has committed to the provision of a number of Destination Charging points, including the replacement of the unit in Melksham.

I note the Town council is keen to see more EVCPs supplied, and we would be delighted to support Melksham Town Council identify opportunities for additional machines. A number of town councils are undertaking trials in the surrounding areas and we would be pleased to advise you of the lessons learnt. We can also signpost you to grants to aid in the provision.

Wiltshire Council is also pleased to enter into agreements with the Town Council for the provision of chargers on our land.

With regard to your questions regarding where Wiltshire Council is in its process for the replacement of the Kings Street charger. The council has tendered a survey of its workplaces to identify the infrastructure requirements for EVCPs. This survey is underway and will be completed by the end of March. At which time the machine provision can be tendered. The decision to replace the EVCP in Melksham has already been approved. It is hoped the new charger will be in place by the autumn but will be subject to the normal procurement process timetable. Currently the plan is to install a like for like provision with a 44kwh charger. However, this could be subject to change.







For the Melksham Campus I understand the current proposal is to provide 3 number 7 kwh EVCPs which service 6 vehicles. I am advised that this is the maximum number due to the external power supply infrastructure. These will be open to public use once operational.

I trust this answers all your questions.

I am writing to you as part of the pre-consultation process for the introduction of an Off Street Parking Order at Melksham Campus. Following the feedback on our previous consultation at the end of January 2022 on the proposed restrictions, an amendment has been made to our proposal for the Off-Street Parking Order for the site.

It is a pre-occupation Planning condition for the development of the Campus that the facility cannot be brought into use until a car parking management plan has been submitted to Planning and implemented in full in accordance with the approved details. The restriction order will ensure there is reasonable availability of parking for users of the campus.

It is proposed that the area outlined in yellow on the attached site plan will be covered by an Off-Street Parking Order. This has not changed from the first consultation.

Proposal

It is proposed that parking at the Community Campus is pay and display in line with the other car parks. This will align the Community Campus Car Park with other long stay car parks in Melksham and with Wiltshire Council's overall policy that car parking is chargeable. All Wiltshire Council managed public car parks in Melksham are chargeable. The current parking charges, days and times are as follows:

Open	24 hours
Charges apply	Monday - Saturday 8am - 6pm excluding bank holidays
Current charges	Up to 1 hour: £0:30 Up to 2 hours: £1.10 Up to 3 hours: £2.00 Up to 4 hours: £2.70 Up to 5 hours: £3.60 All day £5.00
Blue badge	Free
Maximum stay	All day - No return in 3 hours
Blue badge	All day
Pay & display	3 machines (one in each area of the car park) Wiltshire Council MiPermit Portal Coin - no charge given Chip and pin and contactless

The parking meters will operate the MiPermit system in line with the other car parks in Melksham. This allows the issue of virtual permits for staff, on site clubs and partner organisations (number of permits to be negotiated with each organisation).

The hours that the order covers are proposed to be 8am – 6pm to align with other car parks in Melksham. The opening hours of the campus will be between 6am and 10pm Monday to Saturday and 7am and 10pm on Sundays and an Off-Street Parking Order will be placed on the car park to facilitate enforcement. Given the proximity of the campus to the town centre it is proposed that the patrolled hours are 8am to 6pm Monday to Saturday with free parking on Sundays and bank holidays. Enforcement Officers operate seven days a week and the number of patrols per day can be varied depending on perceived need.

Additional information:

- Customers will pay for a ticket displaying the time of arrival, from a parking machine which they will display in their vehicle
- There will be one solar powered parking machine in each of the three car park areas
- Parking restriction signage will be placed in each car park
- There are 201 spaces overall which includes 17 accessible, 12 family and six electric vehicle (also accessible) bays
- The car parks will be regularly patrolled by Parking Enforcement Officers
- Vehicles must be parked within a marked bay.
- A formal consultation process on these restrictions will take place in the coming weeks.

Points for consideration:

- Due to the proximity of the Campus car park to the town centre, not charging for parking is more likely to lead to insufficient spaces for users of the facility. It has been considered that non-campus users are more likely to park in the free spaces when they would normally use the other pay and display car parks
- This approach provides long stay parking provision for variable lengths of stay, rather than restricting the length of stay
- Users of both the Library and Melksham Blue Pool currently pay for parking in the public car parks and therefore this proposal does not present a change
- The above-mentioned charges are the current rates. It should be noted that charges are currently under review.

This revised proposal brings all public car parks in line with the Council's charging policy for public car parks, ensures that spaces are prioritised for users of the campus facilities and maintains the ability for staff, on sites clubs and lease organisations to be issued with virtual permits via MiPermit.
