Some casework I have worked on and currently working to include:

- Requesting improvements to the footway and parts of the roads around Sherwood Ave and Savernake Ave through Wiltshire Highways at Wiltshire Council.
- Parking and on-going parking concerns throughout the Melksham Forest Ward.
- Street lighting
- Various highway road markings improvements
- Providing ongoing support and guidance to residents

Chairs Report – Community Development Committee – Melksham Annual Town Meeting 2022

When I became a councillor, I wanted to see how the council can improve the connections and engagement it has with Melksham's community groups, and I was privilege to be voted as Chair of the Community Development Committee (CDC) for this term.

The Committee is responsible for matters relating to all events staged, managed or involved with in relation to the Town.

The committee is made up of 7 elected members;

- Cllr Simon Crundell (Vice-Chair)
- Cllr Pat Aves

Since the May elections in 2021, the CDC has met 4 times, with me as Chair on 3 out of 4 meetings.

To date the Community Development Committee has proposed:

- To re-form the Community Arts Project Working Group
- To support the Southwest in Bloom Competition and Melksham in Bloom
- To support the Jubilee Tree planting, and to organise a resident's tree planting scheme
- To support the Cloth Road Arts trail project
- To organise Queen's Jubilee Celebrations

The committee also agreed to start a new 'virtual hub' and currently has a Virtual Community Hub Working Group, working on a specification and user needs analysis for the virtual hub.

We have a fantastic amount of community/voluntary groups and organisations in our town, and the Community Development Committee agreed to continue to hold meetings of the Community Groups Network on a two-monthly basis, the network is a great chance to share ideas and network amongst community groups to as many groups represented as possible.

Overall, this year on the Community Development Committee has been very rewarding one, and I have been thrilled to chair what I believe is the most rewarding committee of the council!
