Review of Sensory garden Tender Document

Report of the Head of Operations

1. Purpose of the report.

As requested at a previous meeting, Councillors wanted to review the Sensory Garden tender specification to ascertain its relevance on what they believed the residents wanted.

2. Current Situation.

The area for the Sensory Garden has been identified as the wooded strip of land in KGV along the side of the road at Lowbourne

3. Background.

The Sensory Garden project has been mooted several times over the last 18 months and for one reason or another has yet to take off.

4. Financial implications

A potential cost of £80k has been discussed, looking at the work that was proposed but also a smaller scheme that could be built up and added to over a phased schedule of several years works has also been discussed.

5. Costings

The budget for the smaller project was discussed at £20k.

6. Links to Town Council policies and core values.

The project was part of the original master plan for KGV

7. Risk assessment.

There is a risk that the compacted subsoil and spoil may not allow flora to reach its full potential due to the nature of the make-up of the media in that area.

8. Crime and disorder implications.

The design of the facility should be such that there are no hiding places for ASB or drug use, which would detract from the ambience of the area.

9. Biodiversity considerations.

Wherever possible, natural materials will be used and sourced locally from sustainable resources.

10. Safeguarding.

As the users of this type of facility have the potential to be children and vulnerable adults, it is important to reccommend that participants should be accompanied.

11. **Recommendations.** The Council consider the current tender spec (attached) and decide the value and funding source that they would like to attach to this project.
