Report of the Communications and Events Officer

Purpose of the report

Members to consider funding free yoga classes in King George V (KGV) by Park Yoga.

Proposal

Melksham Town Council Officers contacted Park Yoga to explore the possibility of running yoga sessions in King George V.

Sessions run for 20 weeks from the beginning of May to mid-September. All sessions are held on a Sunday at 9:30 am and are for people of all ages and abilities.

About Park Yoga

Park Yoga is a registered charity: 1183253. This number has been checked with The Charities Commission.

Their mission statement on their website states

'Park Yoga is for everyone. Our mission is to improve the health and well-being of the public by providing free yoga sessions in an open space for the public benefit. The beneficiaries will extend to those living throughout the UK regardless of age, disability, gender, or ethnicity.'

'Attendees this year were 49.3k across the season, this is an average of 1,542 per site, 77 per week. Ranging from 16 attendees (on rainy days) up to 250 attendees per week (on well-established sites). Hopefully, this gives you an idea of the size and scale of some communities we are reaching, and how impactful it is.'

Benefits

Promoting a healthy lifestyle.

It brings people together to enjoy the outdoors and exercise as a group, which has additional social benefits, particularly for families, and helps to make Melksham an attractive place for people to visit.

It has very few barriers to entry, and it is free for users.

Has the potential to increase footfall which may benefit Town Centre businesses including Cricketer's Café.

Financial implications

Classes would be free to all participants, although Park Yoga does solicit donations from participants. The arrangement is that the Town Council are asked to fund the cost of the yoga instructor for £70.00 per session, totalling £1400 for one year.

Park Yoga support (equipment, training, admin, marketing etc) to the value of £1500

Future costs may be subject to change.

How other Town Councils have dealt with Park Yoga

Devizes last year provided a subsidy of £420 towards costs in the hope that it would increase revenue at the park cafe. There was no significant change in revenue. This year they were not willing to provide any subsidy and Park Yoga said they would try to find alternative funding. This was successful as the sessions were taking place. Devizes Council were happy with the service provided by ParkYoga.

Chippenham did not deal directly with Park Yoga but arranged a 4-week taster period through Wilts & Swindon Sports Partnership. This was successful and this year they are paying £1050 with the rest of the funding being sourced by Wiltshire and Swindon Sport. In effect, Chippenham Town Council merely supply the site.

Environmental considerations

Possible use of car travel to the session.

The event uses a mobile P.A system. This may be a problem for neighbouring houses, depending on the exact location.

Risks

Possible low turnout.

The sessions run every Sunday morning from May to mid-September and may conflict with other regular and annual events. Junior Parkrun starts at 8:30 am and finishes by 9:30 am.

Recommendations

Members are requested to decide whether to fund Park Yoga in KGV in 2024 at a cost of £1400 and inset this into the budget for 2024-2025.

Purpose of the report

Improving well-being and phone boxes looking more attractive.

Risks

Vandalism.

Melksham Town Council to authorise the use of telephone boxes for floral display.
